Adding a renewable source of energy, such as solar-PV and using energy efficient appliances and systems helps us get closer to net-zero residential structures. All of these building materials contribute to LEED certification, through credits earned in the Energy & Atmosphere category. Locally, Buchanan High School in Clovis is constructing a new facility, called the Buchanan Energy Center, including many of these materials as well as radiant floor heating and a green roof.
